Primary Teacher's Guide





INTRODUCTION

In this document you'll find pre and post activities related to the story of *The Three Little Pigs*, to do before and after having been to the theatre. We encourage teachers to work on the activities which are appropriate for their students, and adapt them if necessary, based on the classes/individuals educational needs.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To learn about the play
- 2. To work on student's moral values such as empathy, friendship, respect for individual differences in society.
- 3. To participate actively in activities related to the story of The Three Little Pigs.
- 4. To learn English vocabulary related to the story.
- 5. To encourage the desire to start reading stories in different languages.



BEFORE GOING TO THE THEATRE

Once upon a time there were three little pigs who lived in a forest and made lunch boxes for all the other animals. But one day, they met a very, very hungry wolf who wanted to eat them too.

When the little pigs realised the wolf was after them, they built 3 houses to stay safe: one made of straw, another of wood, and the last one of strong bricks. The wolf tried to blow down the straw and wooden houses, so the pigs ran to the brick house. The wolf huffed and puffed, but he couldn't blow down the brick house. The wolf was tired from trying to blow down the houses so he left. The three little pigs lived happily ever after, knowing their teamwork had kept them safe.






4. Labyrinth.

Can you help the three little pigs find their home?






5. Counting. Can you count how many pigs, wolves and houses you can see?
